My growing up years followed the typical course experienced by many of our forbearers who came to America as immigrants. Arriving at SFO in June 1963, I joined many of my fellow "fresh-off-the-boat" (in my case, fresh-off-the-plane) travelers negotiating immigration, customs and finally meeting my aunt and uncle who sponsored our family from Hong Kong. I vaguely remember traveling to Oakland riding in my uncle's car on the upper deck of the Bay Bridge (back then the lower deck was for trains and the upper deck carried traffic both ways). Coming from Hong Kong, their four-bedroom home felt like a mansion. They had a front and back yard covered with grass and a rickety swing set that their kids had already outgrown, but perfect for my brother and me. We soon moved to San Francisco

after three months living with them into a flat in a little alley midway up Telegraph Hill, in the shadow of Coit Tower. We were quickly introduced to San Francisco Chinatown and my parents quickly enrolled us in Chinese school soon after introducing us to the local elementary school. My brothers and I spoke no English, but we quickly picked it up and easily assimilated into western culture.

In many respects, my story mirrors many in the CBM 50+ community and reflects the foundation of the church planting work of Pastor Sen amongst the English speaking Chinese. There are still pockets of immigrant communities in the San Francisco Bay Area very similar to what I experienced when first coming to America. The Visitacion Valley and Oceanview districts of San Francisco where CBM is actively working on planting churches are majority immigrant families. However, much has changed in the intervening years. Though

CHALLENGE FACING CBM

the immigrant mind-set is very similar, the receiving culture has changed dramatically. This the challenge facing CBM in its future planting efforts as even in the neighborhoods mentioned, there are other immigrants besides Asian and long time residents who need the gospel. Gone are the days where racial isolation required a narrow focus. The ongoing planting efforts require teams of people who understand the word of God and the world of God. The culture has changed and demands our adjustment. While indeed, there is really nothing new under the sun, nevertheless, each generation has the mandate to proclaim the gospel and the responsibility to make the proclamation as clear as possible. We see this challenge every year in our summer youth camps. The questions of faithful living is becoming more and more complicated, but the staff continue to bring biblical answers and the model of devoted lives for all to see. The joy of the work is to see God raise up men and women who gladly serve the Lord Jesus by taking the time to pour their lives into the younger generation. They sacrifice their time, talent, and treasure by paying the camp fee and spending their valuable vacation with the youth.
